The Association of the Universities of Asia and the Pacific (AUAP) was established on July 28, 1995, by Suranaree University of Technology (SUT), the first autonomous university of Thailand based on the initiation and inspiration of UNESCO. Thus, as a non-government organization, AUAP holds the highest consultative status with UNESCO. Fifty-one (51) higher education institutions assembled in Nakhon Ratchsima, Thailand and signed the Founding Charter of AUAP. Its primary purpose is to be the main platform for interaction and collaboration between members, and to be an effective voice of universities in Asia and the Pacific region.

The leaders of AUAP have adopted a unified vision for the organization and that is the promotion of the general welfare and good image of their members. Through the cooperation of all these leaders, AUAP has the capability to shape and influence the outlook of higher education regionally and globally. he first ever World Laurel Exchange (WorldLex) virtual exchange program hosted by the Lyceum of the Philippines University-Batangas in partnership with the Association of Universities of Asia and the Pacific was held on March 22-27, 2021. WorldLex endeavors to showcase the best features, traits, practices programs of the participants to cultivate an enriching environment that fosters mutual growth, camaraderie, and international understanding. More than one hundred registered participants from China, Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, and the Philippines attended the week-long program of the University.



There were five different topics delivered by various speakers who were all experts in their respective fields. A breakout session was provided every after talks for the delegates to share their insights about the topic which they presented to the rest of the participants.

The program started with the welcome remarks of Dr. Ricardo Pama, AUAP Secretary General. This was followed by the presentation of the history of the Philippines including tourism, cuisines, culture, and arts of the country and Batangas province. Participants were also asked to share something about their respective countries. Part of the program was the discussion and presentation about community service, environment and culture.

The delegates shared the best practices of their institutions in terms of environmental protection, community service and their country's famous tourist destinations.





A group discussion on how to make a place livable and sustainable by protecting their environment also took place during the week-long program. The closing ceremony was conducted with a very nationalistic appeal. Participants were asked to attend the virtual closing program wearing their national costumes which expressed the identity and diverse cultural backgrounds of the participants.

The Lyceum of the Philippines University-Batangas is looking forward to more interactive international programs like this that will connect students from different parts of the world.

Introduction:

United International University (UIU) established in 2003, is a private university approved by the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh and University Grants Commission (UGC).

UIU is one of the top-ranked private universities in Bangladesh, and has been ranked among the top 350 universities in Asia, according to the list of QS Asia University Ranking 2020.

Founded in February 2002, ULAB received the permission to open from the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh in November 2003, pursuant to the Private University Act 1992.



ULAB is an institution devoted to developing young minds to their fullest potential through the free and creative pursuit of knowledge. Alongside such intellectual growth, it is also firmly committed to helping the young men and women in our charge to become responsible and caring citizens of their nations, and indeed of the world.

From a single campus in Mohakhali with only 52 students, ULAB has grown to

be one of the best private universities in the country, with over 4,500 students, permanent Campus in Mohammadpur, exclusive programs of study, renowned research centers, and active co-curricular programs. In order to fulfill its aims, ULAB adopts an array of traditional and innovative academic and extra-curricular programs, and brings to its students paramount lessons and accomplishments in the arts and sciences from around the world.



#### 3. SRM Institute of Science and Technology (SRMIST), India

#### Introduction:

SRM Institute of Science and Technology, is a <u>private deemed university</u> located in <u>Kattankulathur</u>, <u>Chengalpattu</u>, <u>Tamil Nadu</u>, India, near <u>Chennai</u>, and it was founded in 1985 as SRM Engineering College in Kattankulathur. SRMIST has six (6) campuses, three (3) in Tamil Nadu — Kattankulathur, <u>Ramapuram</u> and <u>Vadapalani</u>, one(1) in <u>NCR Delhi</u>, one (1) in <u>Sikkim</u> and one (1) in <u>Amaravati</u>.



Presently, about 50,000 students are studying in SRM College, and was ranked 2nd private institute in India for <u>Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements</u>, and with the <u>QS World University Rankings</u> of 301–350 in Asia in 2020.

UVPA specializes in <u>art</u>, <u>design</u>, fashion and the <u>performing arts</u>, and it is the only university in Sri Lanka to offer special degree programmes in the visual & performing arts.



Its primary purpose is to promote and develop the <u>Visual</u> and <u>Creative Arts</u> as well as to offer recognized higher educational qualifications in these spheres of study.




### 8. ChungYuan Christian University (CYCU), Taiwan

Introduction:

Chung Yuan Christian University (CYCU) is a <u>private university</u> in <u>Zhongli District</u>, <u>Taoyuan City</u>, <u>Taiwan</u>. It was established as Chung Yuan Christian College of Science and Engineering (CYCC) in October 1955, by a group of Christian educators and local nobility, to train science and engineering talents in the Christian spirit. On 1 August 1980, CYCC was elevated to a full university and renamed Chung Yuan Christian University (CYCU).





Ministry of Education (Taiwan), has evaluated and rated CYCU on several occasions as the best private comprehensive university in Taiwan.



#### 9. Industrial University of Ho Chi Minh City (IUH), Vietnam

Industrial University of Ho Chi Minh City (IUH) formerly known as Ho Chi Minh University of Industry (HUI), was upgraded to become Industrial University of Ho Chi Minh City in December 2004, by the Prime Minister according to the Decision of 214/2004/QD – TTg, and it operates under the management of the Ministry of Industry and Trade. Currently, IUH is one of the big educational and training institutions in Vietnam, and ranked in the top 650 of Asian universities of the QS World University Rankings in 2020.



Besides enhancing professional quality of the administrative and teaching staff, investing in the best teaching facilities, learning and action research, the university also pays much attention to providing high quality training services for thousands of students from almost all areas nationwide.
